Ascetica Jan 01 2020 Papers presented at the Eleventh International Conference on Patristic Studies held in Oxford 1991 (see also Studia Patristica 24, 26, 27 and 28). The successive sets of Studia Patristica contain papers delivered at the International Conferences on Patristic Studies, which meet for a week once every four years in Oxford; they are held under

the aegis of the Theology Faculty of the University. Members of these conferences come from all over the world and most offer papers. These range over the whole field, both East and West, from the second century to a section on the *Nachleben* of the Fathers. The majority are short papers dealing with some small and manageable point; they raise and sometimes resolve questions about the authenticity of documents, dates of events, and such like, and some unveil new texts. The smaller number of longer papers put such matters into context and indicate wider trends. The whole reflects the state of Patristic scholarship and demonstrates the vigour and popularity of the subject.

Cyclic Form and the English Mystery Plays Jan 13 2021 *Cyclic Form and the English Mystery Plays* is centred upon the five extant English mystery cycles with a view to examining the cyclic form they share. It is based upon consideration of the differences between the texts and upon the underlying assumptions governing this dramatic form. The cycles are extensively compared with practices in the cyclic dramas of France, the German-speaking areas, Italy, the Netherlands, and Spain in the late middle ages and the early modern period. There is also a unique and innovative bridging with iconographical material from a range of artistic modes giving further insight into the structure and organisation of cyclic form. *Cyclic Form and the English Mystery Plays* should be of interest to undergraduate students and to more experienced researchers in the early drama and the study of visual images and artefacts.

'*Le Roman des Eles*', and the Anonymous: '*Ordene de Chevalerie*' Dec 24 2021 Scholars and students working on the early courtly and chivalric literature of medieval Europe will have often felt the need for contemporary theoretical material with which to illustrate their arguments about courtesy and chivalry in romances, etc. The present volume, which presents critical editions of the two earliest didactic poems of this kind in the vernacular (both date from the first quarter of the thirteenth century), was conceived partly to fill this need. This book will be of interest not only to specialists in Old French literature, but also to those studying other literatures; both texts are known to have circulated in England in the fourteenth century and are therefore of importance for anglicists; *L'Ordene de Chevalerie* was adapted into Middle Dutch and Italian several times and provides excellent material for comparatists, netherlandists and italianists; moreover, given the germinal place of Old French literature in the culture of the Middle Ages, both poems are worthy of study in the context of the evolution of the ideals of courtesy and chivalry as European literary phenomenon. Each critical text is accompanied by an extensive literary introduction and philological apparatus, and translations into modern English prose have been appended to render the poems more accessible to non-romanists.

The Strange Case of Ermine de Reims May 29 2022 In 1384, a poor and illiterate peasant woman named Ermine moved to the city of Reims with her elderly husband. Her era was troubled by war, plague, and schism within the Catholic Church, and Ermine could easily have slipped unobserved through the cracks of history. After the loss of her husband, however, things took a remarkable but frightening turn. For the last ten months of her life, Ermine was tormented by nightly visions of angels and demons. In her nocturnal terrors, she was attacked by animals, beaten and kidnapped by devils in disguise, and exposed to carnal spectacles; on other nights, she was blessed by saints, even visited by the Virgin Mary. She confessed these strange occurrences to an Augustinian friar known as Jean le Graveur, who recorded them all in vivid detail. Was Ermine a saint in the making, an impostor, an incipient witch, or a madwoman? Renate Blumenfeld-Kosinski ponders answers to these questions in the historical and theological context of this troubled woman's experiences. With empathy and acuity, Blumenfeld-Kosinski examines Ermine's life in fourteenth-century Reims, her relationship with her confessor, her ascetic and devotional practices, and her reported encounters with heavenly and hellish beings. Supplemented by translated excerpts from Jean's account, *The Strange Case of Ermine de Reims* brings to life an episode that helped precipitate one of the major clerical controversies of late medieval Europe, revealing surprising truths about the era's conceptions of piety and possession.

Baroque Self-Invention and Historical Truth May 17 2021 In his monumental study, Christopher

Braider explores the dialectical contest between history and truth that defines the period of cultural transition called the 'baroque'. For example, Annibale Carracci's portrayal of the Stoic legend of Hercules at the Crossroads departs from earlier, more static representations that depict an emblematic demigod who has already rejected the fallen path of worldly Pleasure for the upward road of heroic Virtue. Braider argues that, in breaking with tradition in order to portray a tragic soliloquist whose dominant trait is agonized indecision, Carracci joins other baroque artists, poets and philosophers in rehearsing the historical dilemma of choice itself. Carracci's picture thus becomes a framing device that illuminates phenomena as diverse as the construction of gender in baroque painting and science, the Pauline ontology of art in Caravaggio and Rembrandt, the metaphysics of baroque soliloquy and the dismantling of Cartesian dualism in Cyrano de Bergerac and Pascal.

La Muerte De Angelique Vitry Aug 20 2021 La Muerte de Angelique Vitry (Sinopsis) William Johnson fue una de las figuras centrales en la guerra entre los canadienses franceses y los británicos (1756 - 1761) por la posesión de Canadá. Él era un irlandés de gran tenacidad y encanto, que consiguió galvanizar a los indios nativos americanos en una poderosa fuerza de combate, aliándolos con los británicos, y finalmente derrotar a los canadienses franceses en la batalla de las Llanuras de Abraham en Quebec. Aunque Johnson es una poderosa figura política y rico terrateniente (que ofrece una recompensa de cinco libras por cualquier cuero cabelludo francés del Iroquois en vez), tiene algunos defectos de carácter grave, una de ellas es una duda sobre su capacidad sexual. Con el fin de compensar este rasgo neurótico, trata de seducir a todas las mujeres a la vista, sin importar la edad o el origen étnico, y, finalmente, los contactos fallidos. Una mujer no logra seducir, sin embargo, es una joven pelirroja francocanadiense llamado Angelique Vitry, que le recuerda a Kathleen, la muchacha irlandesa pelirroja que dejó atrás en el condado de Cork, Irlanda. Angelique es solo once años de edad, pero se ve dieciséis años. Era un huérfano cuya madre murió en un barco trayendo inmigrantes irlandeses a Canadá. Criado por monjas en un orfanato católico en Montreal, es un joven reprimido, totalmente ignorante de las relaciones sexuales. Cuando ella se hizo amiga de Johnson, ella se obsesiona con él, y se desarrolla un embarazo psicológico. Johnson se debate entre la devoción paterna para el joven y una atracción que está profundamente arraigada en la semejanza de la niña a Kathleen. Ama de llaves de Johnson, Mary, cuyo padre es jefe Hendricks de la tribu Iroquois, ha vivido con él durante muchos años y le dio un hijo llamado ligero como una pluma. Ella tiene celos de Angelique, y convence a su padre de que la niña está poseída, y debe ser destruida antes de que ella se extienda una epidemia en toda la Nación Iroquois. Esto pone a Johnson en un dilema: si se aferra a Angelique, se arriesga a perder el apoyo de los iroqueses en una próxima batalla decisiva contra los franceses, y si él la deja ir, gana su apoyo. Él la deja ir, pero los iroqueses no logran mantener su parte del trato, y deciden grabar Angelique en juego, convencido de que ella es una bruja. Johnson salva la vida de Angelique por contar con uno de sus soldados escoltan de vuelta a su casa en Quebec, a sabiendas de que, al hacerlo, tendrá que luchar contra los franceses por su cuenta. Más tarde, Johnson es herido en la batalla. Durante un retiro, se refugia en una cabaña que sus soldados se han encontrado en el bosque. Irrónicamente, resulta ser la casa de su padrastro y madrastra de Angelique, que ahora le han prometido a un sargento francés que odia. Mientras que Johnson se recupera de sus heridas de batalla, con Angelique le enfermera, descubre una cruz de oro en poder de Angelique, el mismo que le había dado a Kathleen, de vuelta en Irlanda. Johnson es devastada por la constatación de que se senta atraído sexualmente a su propia hija, y le roba lejos de ella una vez que está lo suficientemente bien para viajar. Una amnistía en la guerra es declarada, y la celebración se lleva a cabo en los terrenos de la finca de Johnson. Ahora se ha convertido en gravemente enfermo con la enfermedad venérea. Mientras que él está dando un discurso ante sus tropas, ligero como una

pluma suministra el cuero cabelludo de su hija Angélique le reclama la recompensa de cinco minas. Johnson seala airadamente su espada , y está a punto de matar a su hijo cuando se distrae por una visin que l tiene de Kathleen le acercaba por el bosque. Ligeramente como una pluma ve su oportunidad y conduce un cuchillo en la espalda de su padre. The Origins of the University Jun 25 2019 The University of Paris is generally regarded as the first true university, the model for others not only in France but throughout Europe, including Oxford and Cambridge. This book challenges two prevailing myths about the university's origins: first, that the university naturally developed to meet the utilitarian and professional needs of European society in the late Middle Ages, and second, that it was the product of the struggle by scholars to gain freedom and autonomy from external authorities, most notably church officials. In the twelfth century, Paris was the educational center of Europe, with a large number of schools and masters attracting and competing for students. Over the decades, the schools of Paris had many critics--monastic reformers, humanists, satirists, and moralists--and the focus of this book is the role such critics played in developing the schools into a university. Ferruolo argues that it was the educational values and ideas promoted by the critics--ideas of the unity of knowledge, the need to share learning freely and willingly, and the higher purposes and social importance of education--that first inspired the scholars of Paris to join together to form a single guild. Their programs for educational reforms can be seen in the first set of statutes promulgated for the nascent University of Paris in 1215.
