the evidence for evidence based practice implementation patient Mar 07 2021 although the science of translating research into practice is fairly new there is some guiding evidence of what implementation interventions to use in promoting patient safety practices however there is no magic bullet for translating what is known from research into practice to move evidence based interventions into practice several strategies may be needed
